## A QUIET WORKSPACE IS IMPORTANT!

### SET ROUTINES!

Keep all of your child's materials in one space, make a checklist of daily essentials, post your child's schedule, and help with time management.

Allow your child the opportunity to be an independent, active participant in class. It is acceptable to check-in with your child. However, interacting with your child during class is disruptive to the learning process.

## ASK OUESTIONS!

The teacher is there to help! Ask questions about procedures and assignments.
